Who was St. Angela Merici?

January 27th marks the Feast day for St. Angela Merici. This exceptional woman holds a significant place in the Catholic Church as the founder of the Ursuline Order, the first religious order dedicated to the education of girls and the formation of women in the Church. Born in 1474 in Desenzano del Garda, Italy, Angela grew up in a devout family, deeply committed to their faith.
